An Introduction to EquatIO Inclusive Language Tool


EquatIO is available for all students and staff at the Victoria University of Wellington; on University computers and also available to download for home computers and personal devices.

EquatIO allows you to easily create mathematical equations and formulas, generate graphs and worksheets, and create opportunities for collaboration. You can type, handwrite, or dictate any mathematical expression, and EquatIO will convert it into accurate, digital mathematics which can be added to a Microsoft Word document. There's no need for any complicated code or programming languages.
