


WELLINGTON INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAMME

The Wellington International Leadership Programme (WILP) is a free, self-paced, and interdisciplinary extracurricular programme that advances your knowledge of global issues; presents creative, diverse, and innovative approaches to global citizenship; and enhances your intercultural competence and employability.

Complete the programme over the course of your degree by choosing from a wide range of interactive seminars delivered by academics from across the university and by visiting experts; experiential learning and volunteering opportunities both on campus and beyond; and speaker events hosted by the University, the diplomatic community, and other internationally engaged organisations.

- Open to all students (undergraduate and postgraduate, international and domestic)
- Connect with like-minded students and academics (domestic and international) from around the university and the world
- Build your professional networks and increase your employability
- Become eligible for the Global Leader Grant (\$1000) to help support an exchange semester abroad

If you are interested in global affairs, cultural diversity, languages, diplomacy, international opportunities (including exchange), and creating more peaceful, tolerant, inclusive, secure, and sustainable societies, then WILP is the programme for you!
