

The opening of the new Living Building™ and reawakening of Te Tumu Herenga Waka gave this project some parameters, some impetus, and a completion date.

Ngā tau o Te Herenga Waka is a tribute to all who have had a strong connection to Te Herenga Waka marae over the years, and we hope that the current and future students will continue to add their waiata in the years to come.

We also hope this collection of songs will give effect to Ruka Te Rangiāhuta Broughton's words in *Kāre Taku Raru* which states:



is about his ill health,
which is said to have
been the utu (sacrifice)
for the building of the
wharenu. The waiata
urges students and staff
members who enter the
wharenu to uplift each
other, to think critically,
and to engage in higher
learning. This waiata is
performed by the tangata
whenua during most
pōwhiri at Te Herenga
Waka marae.**

Nāwai rā, nāwai rā, ka poipoia rātou, ka tū Māori mai rātou, ā, kei reira tonu ngā ruāhine, me ngā ruānuku ahakoa ngā tai me ngā waka i ū mai ai.

This song was composed by Te Wehi Wright in 2016 and is a dedication to the generation of Māori leaders, in particular Te Ripowai Higgins who has given so much to the many Māori students who attended Te Herenga Waka Victoria University of Wellington.

Using the methodology of the rising and receding of the tide, the song pays tribute to the high tide of calibre and expertise many Māori students have had the privilege of learning from throughout the years. Central to this is the work that Te Ripowai Higgins and others have done to grow and nurture the many Māori minds that come to Te Herenga Waka.

The song then acknowledges the changing of the tide as that generation begins to recede, just as the tide does, but due to the commitment by the older generation, we have been left so much to guarantee the continued rising of the tide for generations to come.

This is testament to the leaders we have had who have shown us the way.
