The Master of Health is part of a tiered family of qualifications. These are staircased so that courses completed for each qualification can count towards the next step.

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE

60 points

2-4 courses

Two trimesters if studied part time, or one trimester if studied full time*

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA

120 points

4-8 courses

Four trimesters if studied part time, or two trimesters if studied full time*

MASTER OF HEALTH

180 points

6-10 courses

Six trimesters if studied part time, or three trimesters if studied full time*

Choose the qualification with the entry requirements, time commitment, and career benefits that suit you.

Entry to these programmes requires a relevant Bachelor's degree (with at least a B average for the Master of Health). For Midwifery, Nursing, and Professional Practice pathways, you must be a registered health professional.

*The duration of study for individual students may vary. The University year has three trimesters, which start in March, July, and November.
